and particularly any and all allegiance to *the King of*
Hanover and that he will bear true allegiance to the
United States, and support the Constitution of the same.

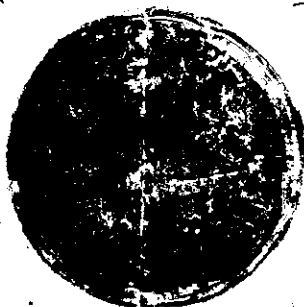

the Court a certified copy of his declaration sworn
to and subscribed by him before the Honorable
District Court of Bexar County, ~~July~~ ~~1850~~
and offers as witnesses J. Fries
and John Sturm which declaration being examined and the
Court having heard the declarations under
oath of said Henry Baumbach.

and being satisfied that
the said Henry Baumbach has faithfully complied
with all the requirements of the naturalization
Law of the United States Congress, and entitled
to the benefits of the same, and he also having
taken and subscribed to the oath required by
Law.

It is therefore ordered by the Court
that the said declaration and oath be recorded
and that the said Henry Baumbach be admitted
to be a citizen of the United States of America
and that the clerk issue to the said

his hand and seal of this Court a
certificate of Citizenship, after having first
recorded the same in the minutes of this Court.

Fidelity to every Foreign Prince, Potentate,
State or Sovereignty whatever and partic-
ularly any and allegiance to the King
of Hanover, whereof he was before a citizen
and a subject
