It is therefore ordered by the  
Court that the said Declaration and oath be  
recorded and that the said Louis Brian be  
admitted to be a citizen of the United State of A-  
merica - and that the Clerk issue to the  
said Louis Brian under his hand and the  
seal of this Court a certificate of citizenship,  
after having first recorded the same in the  
Minutes of this Court.
