of said Louis Briam

and being satisfied
that the said Louis Briam has faithfully com-
plied with all the requirements of the Naturali-
zation Law of the United States Congress, and en-
titled to the benefits of the same, and he also having
taken and subscribed to the oath required by
Law.

It is therefore ordered by the
Court that the said Declaration and oath be
recorded and that the said Louis Briam be
admitted to be a citizen of the United State of A-
merica - and that the Clerk issue to the
said Louis Briam under his hand and the
seal of this Court a certificate of citizenship,
after having first recorded the same in the
minutes of this Court.
