BOOKLET

FAMILY TREE

The following facts concerning the early history of Robert Green and his wife, Louisa Anna Richardson, as stated by Mrs. Newt Berryman, nee' Marietta Green, daughter, Georgia, on Friday, April 14, 1916, are there:

"My father, Robert Green, was born in North Carolina, December 31, 1800. He went to Georgia and was married there in early life, and built the first home in the city of Macon, Georgia. Later in life he moved to a plantation and during the years of occupation there, he was sent as a representative to the legislature."

Mrs. Hellena Berryman, of Alto, a neighbor, and a very close friend of Mrs. Robert Green, wrote an obituary concerning the passing of Mrs. Green and the facts concerning the early history of the family differs somewhat from the above. It stated,

"Died five miles N.E. of Alto, Dec. 31, 1895, Mrs. Luzanny Green. She was born Sept. 6, 1802, in North Carolina. Was the daughter of John Richardson. Moved to Hancock County, Georgia, and was married to Robert Green, on Oct. 16, 1819."

Four years after their marriage, their first child was born and was named Emily. Two years later, another daughter, Lucinda, was born, and thereafter at intervals of about two years, for each, there came Lou, Martha, Minerva, Hal, Marietta, George, and Rinie.

In 1848 because of the glowing pictures of the wonders and opportunities of Texas, Grandfather Green and many others moved to New Orleans to wait for a boat to cross the Mississippi in order to come to Texas. While waiting in Louisiana, the oldest daughter, Emily, died from diphtheria and childbirth. She left her husband, Jehu Allen, and two children, Billy and Betty. The Green family settled in Marshall, Texas, and Robert, assisted by his two sons, Hal and George, and by Richard Avery and Columbus Monk who had come to Texas along with this family, engaged in building and carpentry work. In 1849, they all moved to Cherokee County. He cut the timbers with a whip-saw and the building was erected on this site where the present courthouse stands. Today in Rusk on the old Dickerson home stands a barn made from the original lumber of the first courthouse.

Later, Green moved to the Fillieo Plantation and was assigned the care of the negro slaves as Fillieo, deputy sheriff, had to assume the duties of Sheriff Vaught who had been killed by Roland Hogg. The following year, Fillieo was voted in as sheriff. At the beginning of the Civil War Robert Green was too old to fight and because he had been a representative in the Georgia Legislature, he was assigned the care of the following plantations and their respective slaves: Fillieo, Baxter, Emboden, Manning, Griswold, and Tidwell. Their owners had all gone to war.

Robert moved to the Hill place which is now known as the old Spain place near Central High. There he built a big corn and wheat mill and cotton gin, run by oxen and slaves. It was his duty to feed himself, his family, his slaves, and furnish a certain amount for the soldiers. This toll had to be transported to New Orleans by oxen train. In New Orleans he would buy those necessities that he was unable to raise, and cart them home on his return trips. His daughters, Minerva and Lou, helped him with his accounts and also taught school in the neighboring rural schoolhouse. All of the other female members of the family as well as those women on the other plantations did their part by spinning and weaving linseys and other kinds of cloth for clothing.

Later Green bought land five miles from Alto, joining the Berryman land on the north. There he built his last home, cedar grove, a double log two-storied house containing two sets of stairs which was always a place of interest and curiosity to the many grandchildren.

At the close of the War which had cost him the lives of his two sons and the loss of his slaves, he was heartsick and confused. He became ill and died in 1867 at the age of 67, leaving his wife and six daughters. Although Grandma Green had never learned the art of business as she had attended to her home duties, she managed well for twenty-five years to keep what she had. She was an invalid six years before her death because of a broken hip. In 1895 she died in her sleep. Mrs. Berryman says in the obituary of Grandma Green:

"Grandma Green was noted for her hospitable and charitable deeds, and was loved and honored by all her neighbors. She leaves six daughters and over one hundred grandchildren and great grandchildren to mourn her loss."

FAMILY NOTES

Freddie Luker Parker's childhood memories of the home of her grandfather Robert Green and Grandmother Louisiana Richardson Green.

Grandmother was named for the state, but was called "Louzany". My grandfather died good many years before I was born; my mother was the youngest member of the family. The house was built of logs boarded over on the outside. It was a story and a half with an open hall dividing the two sections of the building. The house faced the north, and there was a long front porch extending from one end to the other, on the east side of the hall was a large room used as a parlor and a guest room, adjoining on the south was a "side room" always used as a bed room. There was a stairway leading from the parlor or living room to the bedroom there was a large open fireplace in the living room. Besides chairs, a lounge, a divan or couch, there was a table on one side against the wall on which was a glass case, containing articles made of wax, there things made by Aunt Lou, were two wax dolls and bowls of peaches, pears, apples, grapes, etc. All the children of the connection were fascinated by the contents of this glass case, which we could look at but were never allowed to touch. My mother, the other, claimed one of the dolls by Aunt Matt. My oldest sister was to fall heir to my mother's and Aunt Matt's only child to hers. The things were never to be separated as long as the old home place remained intact. However when my two aunts

who lived there after their mother passed a way at the age of 93 years, moved to Alto, I think the glass case and contents was carried to Cousin Ed Lee's home, and I do not know what became of it afterward.

On the East Side of the hall did Aunt Matt who took care of her during the night always occupy by Grandmother and in later years a large bedroom? There was a bedroom adjoining, similar to the one on the other side of the house. Also a stairway leading to an upstairs bedroom One piece of furniture in Grandmother's room that was of interest to me was a "safe". My auntie's were wont to split open biscuits, butter each half and sprinkle with sugar for us children. During sweet potato season, they would hand out juicy baked potatoes.

Adjoining the dining room was a south porch, which had a long shelf where buckets of water were kept. The water was drawn from a well quite a distance from the house. I used to delight in accompanying my auntie's to the well.

The yard and garden are the high spots in my memories of the old home place. The garden contained many varieties of vegetables - some that we seldom see in gardens today. Two I will mention, leaks and artichokes. There was always a bed of strawberries, and asparagus. There was sage and rue (not vegetables).

Down the middle of the garden was a walk and on either sides were bright colored, mostly old fashioned, flowers, such as phlox, larkspur, "johnny jump ups", pinks, verbena, sweet Williams, etc. The yard was a large one, entirely enclosed. On both sides of the front walk were cedar trees - a favorite place for us children to play "Pussy Wants a Corner". On either side of the front yard were crepe myrtle trees, syringes, lilac, rosebushes, mostly monthly rose. I remember two mimosa trees, one on the East and one on the West End of the house. On the right side of the steps from the hall way leading to the well was a huge crape jasmine. On the West End of the long porch or "gallery" was a beautiful yellow jasmine vine. These were two of my favorites.

On the left of the walk leading to the well, was a large Spanish Dagger. It was a beautiful sight to see when in full bloom, but we children soon learned to give it a wide berth on account of the "daggers". I have in my yard today some of that same Spanish dagger, as well as white iris from the yard and asparagus from the garden. I brought lilac and other plants, but the three I mentioned were all that survived. Other flowers in abundance were iris, jonquils, hyacinths, and other bulbs. One of the most interesting experiences we children had was to sit on the front steps at eventide, and watch the evening primroses open their petals. We used to have fun of the front porch, playing "Molly, Molly Bright, Can I Get There My Candlelight?"

There was an orchard containing different varieties of apples, peaches and pears. We enjoyed helping gather as well as eating the fruit. There was a separate orchard of plums.

There was a house for chickens, turkeys, and guineas. Also, a smokehouse, with chopping block in front. We children used it for cracking hickory knots and walnuts. We would gather mulberries from a tree nearby and hen while eating them.

The corncrib was quite a distance from the house. It was great fun to watch them feed corn and slop to the hogs- but we sure were on the opposite side of the fence!

There were two sections to the farm- the upland and low land or so called bottomland. They used to grow large crops of ribbon cane on the bottomland; Syrup making time was a great occasion for us children. There was a sulfur spring on the farm with a shady grove around it and we enjoyed drinking the water and trying to like it. On a ditch near by grew Mayprps (sic) and gooseberries. We ate and enjoyed them.

- 12 April 1853 son, George T. Avery b. to Richard I. Avery and Minerva M. Green (father to Bernice and Ima- twins)
- 19 Oct. 1853 Robert Green & Luzana Green were pd. \$800 by James Derrough for several lots
- 11 Jan 1854 daughter, Tarry Belle b. to Richard I. Avery
- 21 July 1855 Madison L. Monroe pd. Robert Green \$600 for 320 acres of land, situated on the waters of the Angelina River, abt. 14 miles N. E. of the town of Rusk commencing at a point on S. boundary of the Troutman League ... ", Deed Bk.vol. # _ p. 225
- 1855 Robert Green moved to the "old home place", 5 miles from Alto, joining the Berryman land on the N.
- 3 Feb. 1856 Isaac Edward (Ed) Lee was b. in Nacogdoches, TX to Lucinda E. Green & Larkin G. Lee, 2nd child
- abt. 1859 Marietta m. Newton (Newt) Berryman & was widowed by the 1880 census
- 1859 Robert Green moved to the "Spain Place" where he lived for 4 or 5 yrs.
- 6 Dec. 1859 Mary Etta Green m. Milton E. Broom (Marietta would only be 16 yrs. old but she's not listed with her parents in the 1860 census.
- 5 June 1860 Census count of Robert Green family includes Luzany, Louisa, Martha, Serina, Minerva Avery, L.. Avery & T. Avery
- 5 June 1860 Slave Schedules Census showed W. Watters and Robert Green next to each other with Watters having 15 slaves & Green, 11. Robert Green is listed as manager for the next 17 slaves.
- Abt. 1860/1 Hal Green was wounded in the Battle of Mansfield & later d. from the effects of his wound- his arm was amputated above the elbow. (never m.)

- 21 Jan. 1868 Marietta Green Broom m. Newton Berryman (had 10 children)
- 1870 Cherokee Co. TX Census listed Luzany Green as the head of the family with Louisa, Martha & Serina A. Green. Also, Minerva Monk, George Avery, Robert C, Monk, Lucinda Lee, Isaac Edward Lee, Laura Lee with blacks listed including a Robert & George Green.
- 21 Sept. 1873 J.B. Luker and his brother, Frank who was 2 yrs. older, went to TX from Alabama & located near Alto Cherokee Co. where J.B. roomed with the "widow Green and family". Frank stayed in E. TX a few yrs. & then joined family who had migrated to Comanche Co. TX.
- 1 Jan. 1873 Serina Augusta (Rena) Green m. James Burette Luker near Alto Cherokee Co. TX. She was 5 yrs. older than he.
- 14 Oct. 1874 Clara Etta Luker (called Sister) b. in Alto Cherokee Co. TX to Serina Green & J.B. Luker
- 28 Jan. 1876 James Robert (Bob) Luker was b. in Alto Cherokee Co. TX to Rena & J.B. Luker
- 1876 J. B. Luker's brothers George, John & sister Susan & families migrated from Choctaw Co. Al. to Comanche Co. TX & stopped on the way to J.B. in E. TX
- 16 June 1877 Freddie Maola Luker was b. in Alto Cherokee Co. TX to Rena & J.B. Luker.
- 2 Nov. 1877 J. B. & Rena Luker joined the Methodist church. Rena had been a Baptist since a girl. J.B. became a Methodist minister & was called to be a circuit rider in E. TX.
- 2 Oct. 1878 Lillian Leota Luker called "Otie" was b. near Alto Cherokee Co. TX to Rena & J. B. Luker.
- 1880- Census showed Luzany Green as head of the family with Lou, Mattie Green, Minerva Monk, Robert Monk, Franklin Banks-a boarder & farmer, age 29 & another boarder, Hector McClure.
- 25 June 1880 Bertha Oleta Luker called "Little Bertie" was b. near Alto Cherokee Co. TX. To Rena & J. B. Luker
- 28 Nov. 1880 Martha (Mattie) Gilmer Green m. F.M. Banks in Cherokee Co. TX (The boarder who was 15 years younger than she.)
- 1880 Census for the J.B. Luker family included Rina, Clara E., Robert, Freddie and Leota.
