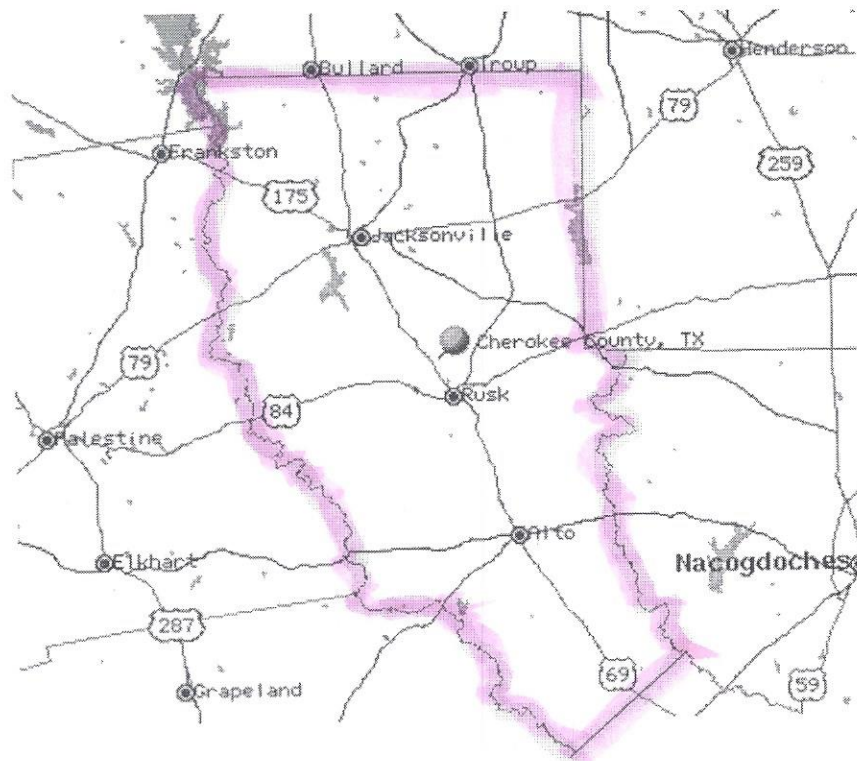
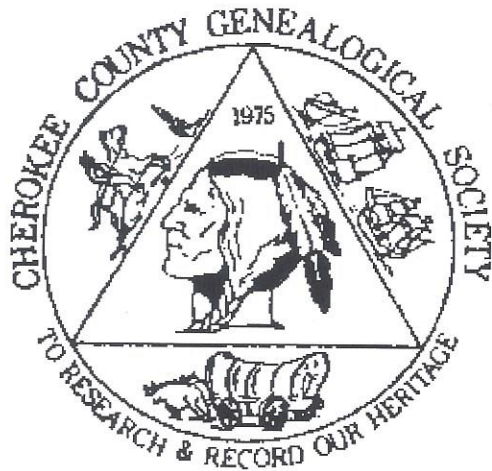

The **"GRAVE MARKER INDEX for CHEROKEE COUNTY TEXAS"** has been compiled by Ira Gaylon White and will be published soon.

This is an alphabetical listing of 29,484 grave markers. Each entry has the full name, birth and death dates, cemetery designator, and a source reference. Other information such as locations of cemeteries, location of graves within cemeteries, who is buried next to whom, etc., must be derived from the original source. It is an unusual book in that it contains a relatively small amount of new information. It mostly just puts old information in a one stop, easily accessed and referenced format. Use of information should therefore be directly credited to the referenced source.

Thanks to those who gave me permission to use their published information. Special thanks to Helen Wooddell Crawford, who is responsible for over half of the markers listed. One can only guess, what difficulty she encountered copying so many cemeteries in so short a time.

Fall Session 1848 continued:

On Motion **Bros. McDonald, Hatch, and Lee** were appointed a Committee to examine Candidates and Licentiates on Literature, Science, Church Government, and theology.

On Motion, **Bros. Gilkerson and Smith** were appointed a Committee on such church books as may be submitted to them.

A letter adapted by **Bro. Charley McDaniel**, a minister of the gospel of the C. P. Church, to the Moderator was ordered to be read and filed which was done accordingly.

On Motion, **Bros. Harris, Wilshire, McDonald, Smith, Gilkerson, Hatch and Reuter** respectively made reports in relation to their ministerial labors since last meeting of Presbytery, which reports were severally sustained and **Bro. Nevills (Bro. McDonald in the Chair)** also reported as to his ministerial labors during the time specified, whose report was also sustained.

An application of **Bro. George Patton**, a Licentiate of the C. P. Church, a resident within the bounds of this Presbytery; he is received under its care.

On Motion, Presbytery adjourned to meet tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock at the Church and concluded with prayer. Saturday morning 9 o'clock Presbytery met pursuant to adjournment; present same members as on yesterday and constituted with prayer.

On Motion, **Bros. Willshire & Sizemore** appointed a Committee on such Church books as may be submitted to them..

Brethren A. J. McGown, ordained minister of Colored Presbytery; **G. S. Templeton** and **J. C. Barrett** of Texas Presbytery were introduced and invited to seats as corresponding members.

Minister **Sam'I Harris** and **Elder Nathaniel Killough** from New Providence Church appeared and rendered excuses respectively for absence , which were severally sustained and they took their seats.

The Committee on Education, through their Chairman, reported as follows, to wit: That there is a continually increasing interest felt by the ministers and members of our church on the subject of education. They regard the present as an age of improvement and advancement in all those arts and sciences that was calculated to ameliorate the condition of the human family and to give character and influence to any church or people and acting under the influence of such views, and believing that the plan of organizing and sustaining Presbyterial and Congregational Schools as recommended to the General Assembly of the C. P. Church, admirably calculated to improve the young in correct knowledge, they are desirous of organizing such schools as soon as practicable but, owing to the scattered condition of our people in this country, - as yet no congregational schools organized within your bounds on the plan proposed by the General Assembly. Our people liberally patronize the Common Schools in their neighborhoods. At the last fall session of your Pres., the Presbytery resolved to organize a Presbytery - School, which resolution was soon afterward carried into effect The school was located Larissa, Cherokee County, Texas and is now in a tolerably flourishing condition under the superintendence of **Rev. Sam'I Harris** and soon no doubt, can by the adoption and continued of proper be made as respectable a School as any of a like character in the country. All of which is respectfully submitted together with the report of the of the School, which report is in the following words

Oct. 20 1848, We the trustees of the New Providence School report to the Trinity Presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church as follows: 1st a large and commodious house for a school room has been erected and furnished and is now occupied by the school.

2nd, the services of the **Rev. T. N. McKee** and **Mrs S. R. Erwin** have been procured as teachers; both competent.

3. The **Rev. Sam Harris** has been chosen by the board of trustees to superintend the institution and also to take charge of the Theological department whenever it is necessary. Which reports were ordered to be spread on the minutes.

The different Committees on Church Books reported personally on the several church books submitted to them respectively, whose reports were concurred in.

The Committee appointed to examine candidates and licentiates submitted the following report being, "that they have examined candidates **Brethren James L. Payne** and **A. I Coupland**, and licentiates **Lewis Reuter**, **Archibald Watkins** on literature, the science of Church government & history and theology, that the examination was was entirely satisfactory as to the acquirement of the licentiates and creditable to the candidates." The Committee therefore recommended that the candidates apply themselves generally to the studies recommended in our Confession of Faith, particularly to the study of theology, until the next meeting of the Presbytery, and that the licentiates be ordained during the present session of Presbytery, which report was concurred in unanimously.

Presbytery adjourned to meet at the mansion of **Bro Gilkerson** at Early Candle Lighting, and concluded with prayer.

Saturday Evening

Presbytery met pursuant to adjournment , the same members present as at the Church and constituted with prayer

Ordered that **Bro Nevills** supply Trinity Church and Ebenezer congregation with preaching each one-fourth of his time for the year commencing on the 1st day of January next.

That **Bro. Willshire** supply Union Congregation and **Col R. W. Smith's** neighborhood each one-fourth of his time

That **Bro. James B. Harris** supply Montvale congregation with preaching one-fourth of his time the ensuing year.; that **Bro. Smith** supply his neighborhood one-fourth of his time; that **Bro. Gilkerson** supply his neighborhood one-fourth of his time.

others who are absent this morning and there being a quorum present, Presbytery constituted with prayer.

The Letter of dismission and recommendation of **Bro. Jeremiah Cunningham**, a Licentiate of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, was read and on application he was received under the care of this Presbytery..

On motion of **Bro. B. B. Cannon**, Ordered that the treasurer pay to **Bro. D. C. Nevills**, our Commisioner to the last General Assembly, the amount of his expenses as such Commissioner, whenever there may be sufficient funds in his hands to make such payment and take **Bro. Nevills** receipts therefor.

On Suggestion, And it appearing that **Bro. Holcomb Gwinn** has withdrawn from the Care of Presbytery and declines being considered a candidate for the ministry any longer, it is therefore considered by the Presbytery that **Bro. Gwinn** be no longer retained under its care as a Candidate for the Ministry.

And the business of the Presbytery being closed as its present meeting is over. On Motion, adjourned to meet at New Providence Church in Cherokee County at 11 o'clock on the 1st Thursday before the 3rd Sabbath in April next and Presbytery concluded with prayer.

Larissa 12th April A. D. 1849

Trinity Presbytery met pursuant to adjournment at New Providence Church in the Town of Larissa, County of Cherokee, State of Texas, on Thursday before the 3rd Sabbath, being the 12th day of April A. D. 1849. Members present:

Ministers: **D. C. Nevills**, **James B. Harris**, and **Samuel Harris**.

Elders: **S. A. Erwin** from Montvale Congregation at Rusk and **Nathaniel Killough** from New Providence Congregation.

Candidate: **James S. Payne**

Absent Minister: **M. Priest**. Licentiates: **R. Martin & George Patton**; Candidate: **A. I Coupland**.

Presbytery was called to order by **Bro. D. C. Nevills**, the former Moderator, and there not being a congregation present, preaching was dispensed with.

And on Motion, Presbytery constituted with prayer, **Bro. Nevills** in the chair. **Bro. Samuel Harris** was chosen Moderator, he having received a majority of all the votes present, whereupon **Bro. Nevills** withdrew from the Chair and the Moderator Elect Occupied it.

On Motion, **Bro Thomas N. McKee** an ordained minister of the C. P. Church and member of Colorado Presbytery, who has become a resident within our bounds and who is now -? -? thereto, is admitted a member of this Presbytery and requested to take his seat as such, which he did accordingly.

On Motion, The Moderator appointed the following Committees to wit: **Bros. Nevills & Killough** on Montvale Church book. **Bros. J. B. Harris** and **Erwin** on Trinity, New Providence, Ebenezer and San Pedro Church books.. **Bros. McKee & J. B. Harris** to examine Candidates and Licentiates on Literature and Theology, and **Bros. Nevills, J. B. Harris and Erwin** on Education.

On Motion, Presbytery concluded with prayer and adjourned until tomorrow morning 9 o'clock.

Friday Morning 9 O'Clock

Presbytery met pursuant to adjournment. Present the same members as on yesterday, and constituted with prayer. The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On Motion, **Bro. Jeremiah Payne** was called on to read a written discourse prepared by him in compliance with an order of last session of Presbytery, which was read and unanimously sustained as popular to ?

The Committee on Montvale Church book reported that they find in the church book submitted to them, "no departure from the Confession of Faith or the usages(?) of the church." which report was concurred in and the Committee discharged.

The Committee on the church books of Trinity, New Providence, , Ebenezer, and San Pedro Churches reported that they find no departure from our most excellent standard, and further that the books of the other churches New Providence, Ebenezer, and San Pedro have not been submitted to them, which report was concurred in as to the church book of Trinity Church at Crockett.

Bro. Geo. Patton appeared and rendered his excuse for absence on yesterday and this morning, which excuse was unanimously sustained.

Bro. R. Martin appeared and rendered his excuses for absences at last session of Presbytery as well as yesterday and this morning, which excuses were unanimously sustained.

Bro. A. J. Coupland appeared and rendered his excuse for absence on yesterday and this morning, which excuse was unanimously sustained.

On Motion, Presbytery concluded with prayer and adjourned till tomorrow morning, 8 o'clock.

Saturday Morning 8 O'Clock

Presbytery met pursuant to adjournment, present..

The Committee on Education made the following report, which was concurred in and ordered to be spread on the minutes: "That the spirit of education generally within the bounds of this Presbytery is on the advance, that the Presbyterian School located at Larissa, Cherokee County, Texas, has just commenced its 3rd session under most favorable circumstances, and it is the opinion of your committee that from the many advantages its proper(?) ability of teachers & _(?) it is well deserving the patronage of the church and surrounding county. And your committee suggests and respectfully recommends that this Presbytery select a suitable name for our Presbyterian School." And in compliance with suggestion and recommendation of the Committee, It is resolved that our Presbyterian School be designated and known by the name of "The Cumberland Presbyterian Literary and Theological Seminary" at Larissa.

On Motion, Ordered that a protracted meeting be held at Crockett commencing on Friday evening before the 1st Sabbath in August next. That a protracted meeting be held at San Pedro commencing on Friday at 11 o'clock before the 4th Sabbath in August next. That a protracted meeting be held at Palestine commencing on Friday evening before the 1 st. Sabbath in September next. That a Camp Meeting be held at New Providence Campground commencing on Thursday before the 2nd Sabbath in September next. And that a Camp Meeting be held at Rusk Campground commencing on Thursday before the 4th Sabbath in September next. Ordered that **Bro. J. S. Payne** attend the Camp & Protracted meetings.

On Motion, leave of absence is granted to Bros. , --(?), & **Erwin** after tomorrow.

Ordered that **Bro. Martin** supply his neighborhood with preaching one-fourth of his time until next Presbytery session.

On Motion, Resolved that Presbytery proceed to the licensing of **Bros. Payne and Coupland** on tomorrow morning. 10 o'clock, and

On Motion, Presbytery concluded with prayer and adjourned to meet on tomorrow morning 10 o'clock to the end that the foregoing resolution go into effect.

Sabbath Morning 10 O'clock

Presbytery met pursuant to adjournment, same members as on yesterday, and constituted with prayer. In compliance with the resolution of yesterday morning, **Bros. J. S. Payne & A. J. Coupland** presented themselves for licensure, and they having heretofore, during the present session of Presbytery, on their several trials, given entire satisfaction, and having also answered affirmatively and entered into the engagements required by our book of discipline, Presbytery proceeded to license them after the address and prayer in manner and form as follows, to wit.:

At New Providence Church, the 15th day of April A. D. 1849, the Trinity Presbytery having received testimonials in favor of **Bro. S. L. Payne** and **A. J. Coupland** of their good moral character, of their being in the communion of the church, proceeded to take the usual parts of trial for their licensure, and they having given satisfactory as to their aptness(?) to teach, as to their experimental acquaintance with religion, as to their internal call to the work of the ministry, and as to their proficiency in divinity, the Presbytery did and do hereby express their approbation(?) of these parts of trial, and they having adopted the Confession of Faith of this church and satisfactorily answered the questions appointed to be put to candidates to be licensed, the Presbytery did and do hereby license them, the said **J. L. Payne** and **A. J. Coupland**, to preach the Gospel of Christ as Probationers for the holy ministry, within the bounds of this Presbytery or wherever God in his providence may cast their lot, and Presbytery concluded with prayer, adjourned until tomorrow morning 8 o'clock.

Monday Morning 8 O'Clock

Presbytery met pursuant to adjournment, present **Brethren D. C. Nevills, J. B. Harris, Samuel Harris, Mat. J. Edmiston, S. A. Erwin, N. Killough, and J. L. Payne**, and constituted with prayer.

On Motion, The minutes were read and approved.

On Motion, **Bros. Bishop, J. B. Harris & Elder S. A. Erwin** were appointed commissioners to the next Gen'l Assembly to be held at Princeton in the State of Kentucky; on the third Tuesday in May next it is ordered that they be commissioned accordingly.

On Motion, ordered that the clerk transmit a copy of rites to the editor of the Texas Presbyterian for publication.

On Motion, and there being no further business appearing, Presbytery concluded with prayer and adjourned to meet at Crockett the Friday evening before the 1st Sabbath in October.

Glorieta Battlefield Preservation

Pat Nagle, authoress of "GLORIETA PASS" and "THE GUNS OF VALVERDE" recently announced the organization of a new coalition (not yet named, it's so new!) to promote the preservation of the Civil War site known as the Glorieta Battlefield, which is located near Santa Fe, NM. The Glorieta Battlefield, often referred to as "the Gettysburg of the West," is one of the most threatened Civil War battlefields in the nation.

Companies D and E, 4th Texas Cavalry were from Milam County, Texas and participated in this battle. Capt. Charles Buckholts, (the town of Buckholts, Milam County, Texas was named for his brother, John), died during the Battle of Glorieta Pass.

The Battle of Glorieta Pass took place from March 16th through 28, 1862 and Union units, commanded by Colonel John P. Slough and Major John M. Chivington defeated General Sibley's forces and necessitated his retreat back to Texas. To read a short history of Sibley's Brigade, visit the Texas Handbook On-Line at:

The Glorieta Battlefield is in danger and the coalition is asking for letters to be written to Gov. Gary Johnson of New Mexico, asking him: (1) to direct the State Highways and Transportation Dept. to resume the Environmental Impact Statement for the relocation of NM 50 highway away from the battlefield; and, (2) to support funding to acquire the remaining private property in the battlefield park area.

Letters from descendents of New Mexico Campaign veterans, historians, Civil War buffs, and/or genealogists will without doubt impress the Governor with the importance of the preservation of the Glorieta Battlefield. It is important to remember that almost one-third of Sibley's more than 2,500 men were lost during the New Mexico Campaign including the Battle of Glorieta Pass.

Hearing from individuals residing outside of New Mexico, who value the preservation of the Glorieta Battlefield, will make an enormous impression.

My Dear Husband

After long and anxious looking I received two letters from you which was dated the 1st & 7th the first one containing the money you sent me they both came together I also received the one that you wrote the 22th of last month the 2 of which I received after I sent mine to the office I was in such a hurry to get it off as it had your discharge in which I hope you have received by this time and on your way home. I will tell you a little about how I am doing up your business Rube Walters came to me and wanted to settle the debt he owes us but he could ascertain what the sum was as the figures were blotted and he could not see whether it was \$30 or \$50's and I want you to write and let me know what it is for he wants to know whether it is for that pistol or not and as for my selling beeves I have sold two one to Uncle Tommy which I let him have it at \$. 25 and then gives me meat besides as much as I want I tried to sell the beef to him for the meat but he would not take it and I let Dr Scarber have the other I suppose I suppose for his Drs bill which I do not know how much that is nor how much my Dr bill is but however that debt is paid. I have not seen any thing of no body from Ben Whites since you left nor heard from them and for my hogs. I have got some of them in the pen to fatten as they would not get fat enough I have had nine up but have killed 3 which leaves me six and we have seen six of the outside hogs two we did not know anything about- well it takes a great deal of corn to fatten them in the corner of the cow pen and one little pig that slips in with them that is very fat which you may have for your Christmas dinner if you get home which I hope you will I also received a letter from Joe dated the 1st of this month he was very well in health was worn out in awaiting he says there is no prospect of getting to come home . We learned yesterday evening that Col Greens Reg Command was ordered to Titus Co. we do not know whether it is reliable

or not this leaves us all in tolerable good health Andrew and bud have both been complaining but the keep up they are mighty good boys the children all talk a great deal about you especially George he is always talking about his Pa We are all very anxious to see you and want you to come home as soon as you can. You spoke of being tired of sleeping with them old bears and for myself I am tired of sleeping with the cubs. I only sleep with three children. Well I believe I have wrote all I can think of at the presant so I will quit and remain as ever your kind and affectionate wife so good by
