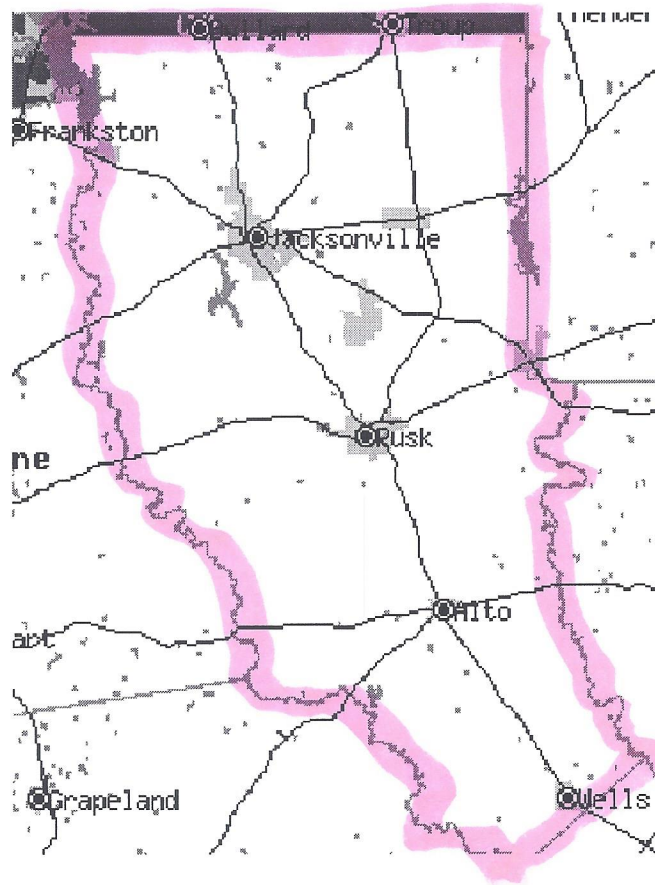

JACKSONVILLE CORPORATION COUNCIL CHAMBER**

Jacksonville, Texas, Feb 23, 1882

*(continued from previous issues)*

The Board met according to adjournment. Present: Mayor Andrews, Aldermen Dillis, Douglas, Sory, Templeton, Morris, and Tilley. Minutes of last meeting read and adopted. Report of Committee appointed to notify applicants for Town Marshal received and Committee discharged. Ballot for Town Marshal resulted in the election of W. M. English, he receiving a majority vote. Mr. Tilly appointed a Committee of One to notify Mr. English of his election.

Messrs. Douglas and Templeton appointed a committee to have ordinances printed, with committees to report at next meeting. Meeting adjourned subject to call of Mayor.

COUNCIL CHAMBER, Jacksonville, Texas, March 6, 1882

Board met on call of Mayor Andrews. Present: Mayor Andrews; Aldermen Tilly, Douglas, Morris, Templeton, Dillis. Absent: Sory.

Minutes of last meeting read and adopted. Dennis Dillis on motion was appointed to act as Recorder Protem.

Object: To appoint a committee to draft additional ordinances, as to be active on our regular meeting to wit: First Tuesday in each month. J. L. Douglas and J. A. Templeton appointed a Committee to draft additional ordinances and submit same at next meeting as stated above. Moved and seconded that Aldermen Morris and Tilley be appointed to examine the calaboose and have the necessary repairs made at the earliest day.

D. Dillis on motion was elected \_\_\_\_\_? by acclamation.

Alderman Morris presented the bill of A. Hardin for services as Clerk of Corporation election one day, Feb. 7th, 1882, which was tabled until next meeting.

On motion the Marshal was requested to cause the roads and streets to be put in a good condition and present the bill of cost to the Board to be acted upon.

COUNCIL CHAMBER  
March 10, 1883

Board met pursuant to adjournment. Present: Mayor Andrews, Aldermen Sory, Dillis, Morris, Templeton, Tilly, and Douglas. Minutes of last meeting read and adopted. Committee Douglas & Templeton reported ORDINANCE NO. 2 as follows, to wit:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JACKSONVILLE, TEXAS -

SECTION 1 That every male person residing within the corporate limits, between the ages of 18 and 45 not exempt by law, shall be required to work on the public roads, streets, and sidewalks within said limits not more than ten days during any one year from the adoption of this ordinance, and the Marshal shall have the power to summons such persons to work from time to time in the same manner as prescribed by the general laws for road overseers.

SECTION 2 Any person failing to perform the duties required tin Section One of this ordinance, after being duly warned by the Marshal, or who shall fail to furnish an able bodied substitute, or who shall fail to pay to the Marshal the sum of one dollar for each day he may be required to work, will be considered guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than one nor more than five dollars for each day he may fail to work.

SECTION 3 Any failure on the part of the Marshal to keep in good condition the public roads, Streets, alleys, and sidewalks in said corporate limits, or for failing to report all persons liable to said duty who fail or refuse to work when legally notified, shall subject him to a fine in any sum not exceeding fifteen dollars for each conviction.

SECTION 4 The Corporation shall have a seal with the words JACKSONVILLE CORPORATION around the margin and TEXAS in or near the center and all contracts, documents, and papers of any kind in which the Corporation may be an interested party shall be attested by an impression of said seal.

SECTION 5 That every vagrant found within the corporate limits shall upon conviction be fined in any sum not exceeding ten dollars.

SECTION 6 The following persons are vagrants within the meaning of the preceding section: 1st., An idle person who lives without any means of support and makes no exertions to obtain a livelihood by honest employment. 2nd., Any person who stands idly about the streets \_\_\_\_\_?,

having no local habitation and no honest business or employment. 3rd., A person who strolls about to tell fortunes or to exhibit tricks not licensed by law. 4th., A common prostitute. 5th., A professional gambler. 6th., Any person who goes about to beg alms who is not afflicted or disabled by a physical malady or misfortune. 7th., An habitual drunk and who abandons, neglects, or refuses to aid in the support of his family.

MARCH 10, 1883 (continued)

Alderman Sory & Dillis will on motion appoint a committee to write out three or more copies of ordinance No. 2 and post same at different places in same corporate limits.

Committee on Calaboose reported that same should be cleaned, ventilated, and secured by lock and key, and on motion the same Committee (Aldermen Morris & Tilley) were appointed a Committee to carry out the work as suggested and report condition and cost at next meeting.

Marshall English reported cash paid out for repairing roads inside Corporation \$6.45 as shown by itemized account. On motion the same was allowed and ordered paid.

The bond of Treasurer Dillis was read and on motion accepted with W. F. Thompson & J. A. Farmer as surities. The same was ordered to be underlined (?) with the words, "CORPORATION OF JACKSONVILLE" instead of "Town of Jacksonville."

Marshall English further reported the sum of \$42.00 pol tax collected which he was instructed to turn over to the Treasurer and take his receipt for the same.

Claim of A. Hardin, for one day's service in holding election, called up on second reading. After a lengthy discussion the same was ordered paid as follows: "One dollar cash and his poll tax receipt for one year." A draft was drawn for the \$1.00 on the Treasurer.

Claim of J. P. Douglas for \$5.00 paid out for printing 100 copies of "Ordinance One" allowed and ordered paid.

J. A. Templeton elected permanent Recorder.

Section 7 of Ordinance Two omitted in foregoing minutes as follows:

SECTION 7: Any person who shall be found in a state of intoxication or drunk-and-down in any public place within the Corporate Limits of the town shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not less than one nor more than ten dollars, and it shall be the duty of the Marshall to arrest such person or persons either with or without a warrant and take his of their bond for his or their appearances before the Mayor, or confine him in the calaboose and bring him or them before the Mayor as soon as sober enough for trial.

Aldermen J. P. Douglas & J. A. Templeton appointed to a Committee to send off and procure a suitable policeman's badge and two pair \_\_\_\_\_(?), also a seal for the corporation and report same at next meeting. Motion to adjourn 'til next regular meeting. Adopted.

I, Mrs. Fannie Helena Hardy, do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of William Arthur Hardy, deceased, who departed this life on the 1st day of Feb'y, A. D. 1917, in the county of Cherokee in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 28 day of June, A. D. 1892, in the county of Cherokee, in the State of Texas

My husband, the said W.A. Hardy, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate Service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$1000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

- 1. What is your age? 57 years - Born June 1859.
2. Where were you born? Cherokee Co Texas
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? 57 years
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? And what is your postoffice address? 57 years, Alto Texas, R.F.D. #1
5. Did your husband draw a pension? If so, give his file number yes - # 25358
6. What was your husband's full name? William Arthur Hardy
7. What was the date of his death? Feb'y 1st 1917
8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? S.C.
9. How long did your husband serve? If known to you give date of enlistment and discharge 4 years

10. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the battalion, regiment or battery of artillery in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service. Enlisted first in 50th S.C. Militia and later in Co E 7th S.C. Regiment -

11. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service

12. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? no

**"Along Those Lines" There's Been a Citing!**  
**By George G. Morgan**

Yes, you read it correctly. I really wrote “a citing” and not “a sighting.” As genealogists of all types, hobbyists, and professionals, it is important to cite our sources, whatever they may be. Those of you who regularly read my columns at Ancestry.com already know that I'm a “library person” and a library advocate. I wear many hats, though. I'm a writer, a business person operating a seminar company, a lecturer, and, of course, a genealogical researcher. I'm also a map lover and can easily spend an evening poring over an atlas, an old Esso road map purchased on eBay, or one of the scores of digitized map sites on the Internet.

In Along Those Lines... this week, I'd like to talk about the value of citing our sources of genealogical data. I promise, it won't be boring!

**“Ibid. Ibid. Ibid.”**

I don't remember precisely when in my school years our assignments changed from being “themes” and “compositions” and became “term papers.” However, I do have a vivid recollection of having to write such a creature in seventh grade for Mrs. Vicki Dillon's “North Carolina History” class. I'd already been busy tracking my ancestors for a couple of years, albeit without knowing I had to cite my sources. (I've been paying for and trying to recover from that omission for decades now!) I had also already been bitten by the history and geography bug, so I actually enjoyed history class.

On this particular day, though, Mrs. Dillon addressed the class and described our assignment. It was 1964, and our mission was to produce a term paper about the North Carolina State Legislature. We could choose to write about one senator or representative, or we could opt to write about the legislative branch of state government and its history. Well, this one was right up my alley, I thought. One of my direct ancestors had been a Revolutionary War-era patriot and had been involved in the early founding of the state legislature. This was going to be a breeze!

It seemed that way for one ephemeral moment--until Mrs. Dillon informed us that we had to also include a bibliography that included no less than five sources AND that it had to have footnotes. Footnotes? “Who writes on their feet?” I remember thinking.

Mrs. Dillon went on to show the class on the chalkboard what a bibliographic citation would look like and what a footnote looked like. Then she uttered a very strange sound: “Ibid.” Someone asked, “What?” And once again she said it: “Ibid.” It sounded like the sound a frog makes. (In actuality, “Ibid.” is Latin for “ibidem,” meaning “in the same place,” and refers to a single source cited in the note immediately preceding.) We were all soon set straight and learned that we had six weeks to complete our 10- or 15-page typewritten document. Sheesh! We had to learn how to type too? Yes, we were also in typing class and now two of our teachers had gotten together to cook up a double-torture for us.

## "Along Those Lines" There's Been a Citing!

As I worked on my magnum opus, I asked my mother, a professional secretary, to help me out. She helped me choose my topic and formulate an outline, but I was on my own for everything else. And so off to the public library I went where Miss Mary Scott Johnson, the librarian and a neighbor, gave me the low-down on bibliographic citations. She also was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, and it was at this propitious moment in my life that she revealed the genealogical community's biggest secret to me: I had to write citations for ALL the information I had accumulated for my family history research to date. I think you can identify with that sinking feeling I felt in the pit of my stomach that day.

### All Those Formats!

Well, the term paper came and went, and I remember getting an A+ on the project. But it was at that point in my life that I learned, with some great coaching from Miss Johnson, that there was a reason behind all this citation madness. During that term-paper project, she introduced me to citation formats for books, magazine articles, and newspapers. As she and I grew to be friends, she also helped this aspiring genealogical researcher to learn that there were other things for which genealogists wrote source citations--and weird things at that. Deeds, wills, marriage certificates, census records, and even tombstones, for goodness sake! Every one of them was a little bit different, but I soon got the hang of the process.

Not all of my source citations are perfect, far from it, but they do contain enough information to track my research sources back. Elizabeth Shown Mills' book, *Evidence! Citation & Analysis for the Family Historian*, is an essential reference guide for every genealogist, and my copy is well-thumbed. I think I've joked with Elizabeth that about the only thing missing from her examples is the embroidered sampler into which my great-grandmother stitched every family member's name and date of birth. (Maybe in the next edition, Elizabeth?)

### Useful Websites

I've found a number of websites that can be of help to you. One of my new favorites is the [Citation Machine](#), created by David Warlick of The Landmark Project.

Simply click on the type of print or electronic resource, located on the left side of the screen, that you want to cite and proceed to fill in the blanks. Voila! You get an instant citation that you can copy and paste into a word processor or genealogy database. Although you still might have to tweak the style a bit to include things such as personal titles (i.e., Rev.) and postnominals (i.e., Ph.D.) and add information regarding repository, it's a great way to quickly generate a quick citation in a pinch. Also be aware that formatting such as underlining and italics may not always transfer to your target software.

If you are interested in using APA, MLA, AMA, Turabian, and/or the Chicago style, check the [Long Island University citation website](#).

This site provides examples of common citation formats for many media.

## "Along Those Lines" There's Been a Citing!

### Summary

Source citation formats for genealogical sources are not a precise science. What is most important is that you provide an informative, reliable, and traceable path that other researchers can follow to access or obtain the same evidence that you used to support your research. The statement at the Citation Machine site really hits home, I think. It says, "Someday the information that the teacher, student, or other information user is citing will be yours."
