

Your letter to Cherokee County Historical Commission was handed to me by John Allen Templeton as I do courthouse research and am familiar with the available records.

Just this morning on our local talk show - swap shop program two people called in who had the name BATTLES, as they pronounced it - one white and one black. In the telephone directory the name is BATTLE. This means I would need enough identifying information on Isaiah Battle to be sure I was researching the right one, as very few of our records indicate color. Some just after the Civil War do.

I charge \$7.50 an hour with no extra charge for going to Rusk as I am down there all along.

If you know when and where Isaiah Battle was born and died, please let me have that information. And let me know what you want to find out. Be as specific as you can, please - and remember deeds can be held off record for years and years. If it is necessary to go to an abstract firm that would be an extra five or ten dollars. And Helen Crawford has all the old newspapers and has done maybe 14 books. She makes a charge to check her master file.

Tax records from 1846 through 1902 are available at our local library.

Send money for three or four hours if you have a lot of questions.

I have recently completed my seventh book on Cherokee County records, am a member of the Cherokee County Historical Commission, and belong to various genealogical and lineage organizations. Nothing is guaranteed except a very careful search for you.

Incidentally, Mrs. Crawford has done 5 volumes on cemeteries of this county on the white cemeteries - but no one has copied the black ones. Death records begin 1903 but were not required until sometime in the late 1920s. Deed records are all available to the present time. Probate records are mostly all there - but some original records were stolen in 1972. Most would have been in the books.

Let me hear from you if you want me to do the research.

Dear Ms. Huttash,

Thank you for your letter. We would indeed like you to do some research for us. We are documenting the lives of Isaiah and Marianna Battle for an educational videotape featuring black history after the Civil War. Both were born in Georgia but the first real history we have is the 1870 census of Barbour County, Alabama listing Isaiah (b. 1840), Marianna (b. 1846) and children Julia (b. 1862), Henry (b. 1864), Lizzie (b. 1866) and Ely (b. 1869). Isaiah and Marianna were owed pre Civil War by a Dr. Battle. We are not sure whether it was the father, Dr. Cullen (3/11/85 - 6/4/79) or the son, Dr. Archibald (9/10/26- 9/30/07). The family thinks it was Dr. Archibald who was referred to as Ofeish but we are not sure. I would like to know which one. Perhaps there is a deed in the period of 1880 with Archibald's name on it.

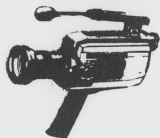

Family history tells us that the Isaiah Battle family traveled west to Rusk, Texas in 1880 (but not before as they are listed in the Barbour County 1880 census.) They traveled with Isaiah's nephew Henry B. Battle and family who settled on an adjacent farm. There Isaiah was to manage a 1000 acre plantation for his former slave owner. Dr. Battle went over also but returned shortly to Alabama for business. They had a cotton gin on the farm and everything was given by Dr. Battle to Isaiah at some point in history.

This story opens many questions so we started to research the deed which Juanita Battle recently located for us. I am enclosing a copy. We will need an abstract to trace the land before 1889. However, the description of the land involved raises questions because it is not what the family remembers. The land they lived on was on the highway leading to Jacksonville (69). It ran along the Short Belt Railroad running from Tyler to Lufkin. Land was owned on both sides of the track. The farm was approximately four miles northwest of Rusk and one block from the Delma Baptist Church. You might want to trace records here as Marianna belonged along with the children. Isaiah was not a church goer until near the end of his life. The person you would contact is Louis Lane, a trustee. I do not have the phone number.

You may also want to talk to Juanita Battle Delaney, 3306 Rolling Hill Drive, Tyler, Texas 75702 (214-597-1999). She is a granddaughter of Isaiah and knows the family history at least as much as we have so far researched. At some point, the farm passed to the eldest son Henry (Isaiah died in 1919). We would like to have a copy of this record and any probate documents you may find. Henry was listed in the 1910 census report as head of household. He received tax bills into the 1930's but the farm was not used by the family during the 20's and 30's. Could you find when ownership passed from the family? The census report of 1900 listed Isaiah Battle as head of household; Henry Battle, son; Rachel Battle, Daughter-in-law; Rosa Battle, Granddaughter; Mamie Battle, Granddaughter; Elie Battle, son; Agnes Battle, Daughter and Jennie Battle (17), Daughter. Marianna Battle was committed to an institution shortly before 1900 because she was no longer mentally fit and died sometime before 1910. Do you have any idea of what this institution could have been? Are there any records?

We are particularly interested in anything that pertains to the life of Isaiah and Marianna Battle. We would like to definitively identify the slaveowner who bought the original land. Do we have the right deed? Any facts you can document are appreciated. I am sending you a check for \$75 to cover your initial expenses and fees. Dear Ms Pomykala:

I need to get a partial report in the mail so this will not be entirely documented as to my sources.

1) The map will show present US 69 Highway. It is highlighted and so is the old route of US 69 which left Rusk on present US 84 and then turned north toward Dialville at Oakland. There will be no conflict now. All the transactions of Isaiah Battle were in the William Bartee league or survey of land out present US 84. You will notice in one deed he grants right of way, 42-191, in 1907.

2) Death Records Book at Rusk (Book 4 I think) shows

Isaiah Battle died 26 July 1920, buried at Holly Springs
W. H. Wallace, Undertaker
He was the son of J I P T A R Battle and Agnes Battle.

Holly Springs is highlighted on the map, north of 84 and west of where he lived.

3) The first footprint found so far of Isaiah Battle is 1889. He is not on
1884 Tax roll
1885 Tax roll

in 1888 Isaiah Battle is on the roll but no land and no poll tax listed. will (re-do.)
There may have been stock and wagons on the right-hand page.

In 1889 - copy enclosed - no land 0- but notice where it reads STEAM ENGINES
OR BOILERS. HE HAS ONE - probably the cotton gin. Also, 1 wagon or carriage
\$15; 10 horses and mules valued at \$325; 10 cattle, \$65;

1890 - Isaiah Battle rendered 983 acres in William Bartee Survey at \$1,000.
He owned 1 carriage or wagon \$15, tools, manufactured implements \$400 (gin")
and cattle, hogs etc.

The 983 acres seems strange - but he could have been misunderstood.

We have Isaiah Battle situated and in business, so to speak. I think I saw a
Walter Battle on the Tax rolls. They are very hard to read!
Will check further.

The mysterious doctor Battle is very elusive.

4) Verne Jackson's HEADS OF FAMILIES IN TEXAS, 1860 and 1870. Margin of error
may be 15 to 20% - but it is the best we have.

5) On this many deeds it is necessary for me to bring them home - and think.
You have X2-529. Here are 2-208 to 12, 2-230-232, and 53-493-4, ten pages.
The latter shows heirs of Isaiah Battle and Mary Ann.

6) A list of all BATTLE marriages in Cherokee County between 1846 and 1905.

7) A summary of BATTLE deed records 1879 - 1914. Mostly complete.

I visited Juanita Delaney yesterday - and her sister and niece.

Will do more next week.

I tried to find Archibald Battle on the census. There were two - not the right ones. Am asking questions around - and hoping to find more.

I have these children of Isaiah and Mary Ann Battle:

- 1) Julia - married Mathis, probably in Alabama
- 2) Henry Hugh married Rachel McDonald in Cherokee County in 1896
- 3) Lizzie married B. J. Jones in Cherokee County in 1896
- 4) Ely - probably the one who married Mary and lived in Oklahoma
- 5) Letha married Hilliard Key in Cherokee County in 1894
- 6) Agnes married Ellie Tidwell in Cherokee County after 1905 (end of my book)
- 7) Jennie married Neely Taylor in Cherokee County in 1905.

This was necessary to identify those trading and buying with Isaiah Battle in order to not miss the doctor?

Do you recognize the Battle in Deed Record 2-208, S. B. Battle? Isaiah sold to him.

Something just dawned on me. There are no witnesses to these deeds!

This was a time that present Rusk State Hospital was then a part of the prison system. Little railroad lines extended out to haul the prisoners. As the timber was cut further and further out, it took so long that camps were built for prisoners to live in. And this was the iron ore boom days! One of these is signed at New Birmingham.

Juanita and her sister recalled that Isaiah Battle hired hands from the prison. And Henry H. Battle probably did, too.

Did you consider that maybe the \$500 came from the doctor - and for some reason he let Isaiah buy the land in his own name?

Isaiah Battle signed with the Christian cross - an X - but apparently no one "beat" him out of his land - tricked him. In boom times there are plenty of scalawags trying to get the money. One gets the feel that he had excellent advisors and great common sense.

I believe that a careful reading of the deeds will reveal that Isaiah Battle sold all his land by 1911.

Will think more on this.

The land Isaiah and Marianne Battle bought, the 1003 acres, would be community property in Texas - meaning she owned half.

he owned half.

Land can pass from husband to wife only by deed or will. Marianne Battle left no will. She is said to have died ca 1910. Dates would fit well. When she died, the children would have owned all her part - but you will observe that most of the 1009 1/2 acres are sold by now.

The 200 acres may have been the homestead but the deed does not say so. I think that is the amount of land permitted as homestead in Texas. The deed does not say this is all the heirs - but we start anyway.

Benjamin Battle born 15 Feb 1893, died 27 March 1913 from Meningitis, son of H. B. Battle and wife Nee Ollie Boners (?). Volume 2, # 1787

Note: One deed record has this BONERS name, I'm not sure of it.

Isaiah Battle died 7-26-1920 son of Jiptar and Agnes Battle, buried at Holly Springs, W. H. Wallace, Undertaker. Black, male, widowed.

Note: In 1920 a death certificate was not required - and neither was an undertaker.

Background on Land Isaiah Battle bought

Deed X2-529-32 refers to Deed W2 pages 453-4-5-6, also states it was conveyed to Harris Kemptner by John B. Reagan, Sheriff May 7, 1889.

W2 453-6 is one of several like deeds. There was a business firm called Gomer, Fariss and Dial (J. W. Gomer, T. L. Fariss, J. J. Dial) There was a lawsuit in District Court in Galveston in 1887 and the firm lost to

1st Harris Kemptner and
2nd Leon Sylvanus and Hyman Blum

I didn't copy amount of judgment - looks like where they bought supplies - and the Court ordered all this land to be sold at courthouse door to highest bidder. It was bought by Kempner (spelled both ways).

I see no way the slaveholder (former) Dr. Battle could have been in anyway involved. You will note that Kempner bought and Leon and H. Blum Land Company sold. Well somewhere that will be cleared up by another agreement or deed.

Now, forward to Index G - 1914 to 1917 All Battle/s

66-338 Deed Jan 9, 1915, filed 8 June 1915 from Susan Linzy (X her mark) to Isaiah Battle. She was widow of Sandy Linzy/Lindsey and re-conveyed to Isaiah Battle all land obtained in Deed Vol. 2 page 230 (copy sent you) They had not paid for the land and as we say, let it go back.



Is there any information about schools that the children could have attended? Since education was so important to the Battle family particularly since they moved to Oklahoma for better schools, this will be an important part of the tape.

Is the Archibald listed in the 1870 census the son of Archey? I would like to rule them out as connected with the Alabama Battles. Dr. Cullen Battle did have a grandson named Archibald who was in the 21 year old age range in 1870. His father was Archibald John son of Dr. Cullen and his mother was Mary Guild.

Please let me know what additional funds you need to continue the research. A good synopsis of education in Barbour County from 1890 to 1910 would be very helpful.

Dear Ms Pomukala:

Next time I goto Rusk I will see if the tax assessor-collector has any information on rendering taxes. This is not legal, but is accurate as far as I know.

1) The tax rolls were based on what the owner rendered. In other words, we would go down each year and tell them what we owned. That was our responsibility. Once you get on the rolls they would consider you delinquent on that property if you did not pay the next year.

2) The requirements for a poll tax were that one had to be a resident citizen for a certain length of time - 6 months or a year, say. And in Texas one had to pay to buy a poll tax. A few years ago this was changed and now we only have to register.

3) Freed slaves received the right to vote after the Civil War, the men.

4) Women received the right to vote in this century - I am not sure whether it was 1920 or the 19th or 20th amendment to the Constitution! You can look that up. My mother born in 1897 was the first female in her family to vote - and her father thought it would be the ruination of the world when women voted!

4) Illiterates could vote. They would ask for help with their ~~rk~~ ballots and the election judge would mark them. In this county in the primary elections Democrats would run against each other. Then in the next election that one would - perhaps - run against a Republican. All the election judge had to do then was ~~vote~~ "the straight ticket" - voted Democratic. Only in these last few years have Republicans won elections around here.

5) There were no addresses on the tax rolls.

6) You may rest assured that Isaiah Battle lived on his homestead where the descendants said he lived - out near Delmar Church. The children would always know, in my opinion. From the records it does look like that he moved in with the son, after the death of his wife (Isaiah's wife) but that is not uncommon. By that time he was old - and probably tired - and that is just what usually happened.

7) About October 1 I will receive a tax statement for my 1989 taxes. If I pay early there will be a discount on some of them, up to 3%, but they will not go delinquent until January 1, 1990.

Ordinarily the one who sells the property is liable for taxes that year. And if the purchaser, for some reason, could not pay taxes the next year he would not go down and render them. Not uncommon. The penalties would add up fast, however.

So far, I am unable to locate a video camera. We dedicated a historical marker to my great, great grandfather in July and I searched "high and low" (as we say here) for one to rent. I guess it would have to come out of Tyler. [searched].

Will see what I can find on education in 1890s in Cherokee County. The lower grades were required but graduation was a rare privilege. There is no doubt the Battles were well educated but that was a privilege Isaiah Battle did not receive, apparently. Or should I say Formal education.

My own step-dad, born in 1890s, received only a third grade education as he had to go to work to help support the family but he certainly used it to good advantage. He could out-figure anyone around.

And my grandfather sat on the porch and read the newspaper- as did Henry H.- and was rather dissatisfied with some of the things going on in Austin! He liked to keep up. Will try to get you the 1887 tax list. I seldom do each year as the writing is so bad! WILL TRY A WHILE LONGER TO GET AN INTERVIEW WITH REV. POLK.

Am enclosing a letter of the 4th. It was held until I visited Mr and Mrs. Roy Gay at Dialville, who interviewed Clevie Battle about Delmar school. He died in 1985. I ran death records and found he was the son of Drew Battle and Octavia Sawyer, died 1985 at age 92, buried in Pleasant View Cemetery.

This and the Pleasant View School are NOT near Delmar, but he did live down there, for a while. Copy of their interview attached. Not much help.

And Drew Battle does not seem to belong to Isaiah Battle.

While in the District Clerk's office, I re-checked the index for Battle. Isaiah is NOT listed. Drew Battle sued Tavis Battle, Final 3576, J-614. And H H Battle sued B J Jones, 9060, E-511. Also H H Battle sued Tom Bruton, 9061, E-512. These are very hard to find and some are missing, so I did not look.

Will hold your latest check until we know more. Will try for an interview this week end if it doesn't rain too much.

Up to now, you would owe me \$15 or \$20. My tape disappeared, the one with the lady in Tyler.
