(Killed in Action)

One Dead, Four Listed Wounded

One county man is reported dead from wounds today and four others are on the list of those wounded.

DEAD

Sgt. Goodwin, 24, member of the Marine corps for nearly six years, died of wounds suffered during the invasion of Iwo Jima, his wife, Mrs. Ruth Goodwin of 1504 Eighth St., was advised officially today.

The Marine Corps telegram said Sgt. Goodwin had been buried in the marine cemetery on Iwo.

LETTERS RETURNED

Mrs. Goodwin was notified soon after the invasion of the Volcano Islands that Sgt. Goodwin had been wounded by shrapnel but heard nothing else until today although letters to her husband have been returning stamped "undeliverable."

Before going overseas, Sgt. Goodwin was an instructor of paratroops at Camp Gillespie, San Diego. Besides the widow, he is survived by a stepson, Leland Edward Rule; a daughter, Doris Katherine Goodwin and his mother, Mrs. Daisy Goodwin, of Fort Worth, Tex.
