Replying to your letter of June 6 you are advised the law of Texas permits Confederate Pensioners to temporarily leave the State of Texas and remain for a period of not more than six months, during which time their right as pensioners is not effected except that no pension warrants are issued during their absence. If your return to Texas should be within six months from the date of leaving them after your return back warrants will be issued to you for the time you have been away. But if for any reason you should remain out of Texas longer than six months, your hame will be removed from the roll and no further payments will be issued to you.

Under this law it would be a violation for me to issue warrants to you and mail them to any one during your absence from the State of Texas.






