Dear Mrs. Hackaby:

The records of this office show one T. J. Ray, not shown as Thomas J. Ray, executed an application for Confederate rension in T was on November 7, 1914. At that time he stated he was 71 years of age. Date of birth is not given. He was born in Autauga County, Alabama and had resided in Tewas since 1859.

T. J. Ray stated he enlisted in March, 1864 in Company "I", 35th Texas Regiment of Cavalry, C. S. A. He stated the officers under whom he served was Col. J. B. Likens, Capt. Mullens, and Lieut. Moore. He was discharged in June, 1865. A private.

The application for pension of Mr. Ray was approved on the affidavit of R. F. Echols who claimed to have screed in the same organization with Mr. Ray, and on the affidavit of J. T. Victory who stated he saw T. J. Ray frequently in the service but he was not in the same organization with him.

Mr. Ray drew a Confederate Pension until his death in September, 1932.

At the time of filing application for pension he was a resident of Longviow, Texas and had lived in Gregg County, Texas for 2h years.

No further information as to the service of Mr. Ray is given.
