"It would have been a bigger turn out if there weren't so many parties," junior Stacy Tillison said. "It was a lot of fun, but they really enforced the rules."




## Bridges Over Troubled















"The coaches and parents were very supportive of us," sophomore Tonya Moffeit said. Every week the parents would bring gift bags for the girls to give them Bearette spirit.











Then people look back at the Bear's football teams, they will have one word come to mind, "family." That was exactly what made this team a district and bi-district champion.

Senior Terry Bonner emphasized this thought after the Hooks game when he said, "People often ask me about my family, but the thing is these people right here in this huddle are my family."

The season was highlighted from its peaks and valleys. From the defeat of a top Texas team, Lindale, to the fall against a surprising Rain's team. Through it all they hung together through 23 major injuries to go two deep into the playoffs.



Even though this was a playoff caliber year, the Bears never knew who was going to be able to play due to a rash of injuries.


"Most of the injuries have been freak accidents," athletic trainer Jeff "Doc" Howard said. "Our kids just played extremely hard."

Too often injured players could be seen roaming the sidelines like Brian Hebert, Bryan Smith and Dusty Speaks (below) on crutches or in wheel chairs.



#### Team travels long road in search of wins




























Reaching for the stars

































### Third time is the charm

After the September bond proposal failed, board meetings became heated and students and teachers both were forced to face the overcrowding together as one big happy family. Of course, there were the occasional complaints, but everyone eventually realized that complaining was a waste of energy.

Even Superintendent Elton Caldwell did not feel very optimistic about the situation. "In my opinion, the district will be forced to purchase temporary classroom space of some type, even if a bond is passed within the next year (due to maintaining the 22-1 teacher student ratio)," Mr. Caldwell said.

But now there is light at the end of the tunnel. The school district is moving ahead with plans to build two intermediate schools (one in Brownsboro and one in Chandler) after voters approved an \$11 million bond proposal in May.

Mr. Caldwell thinks the voters passed the third bond package because it was scaled back from earlier plans in the \$14 million range.

As it turned out, the third time was a charm.
























MANAGEMENT OF THE STREET



Volume 53 of the Brownsboro school yearbook, Bear Tracks, has a press run of 700 copies of 288 pages printed on 80 pound enamel paper with Smyth binding. The pre-kindergarten -12 yearbook was produced for a 3A school district that covers 285 miles and stretches from Athens to Tyler and from Edom to Poyner. There are approximately 2500 students in the district with 700 in the high school.

For this edition of the yearbook, the staff used Souvenier type for the basic typeface with Weidemann as a highlight typeface. The original ideas for the cover and the endsheets were designed by the editors.
