Com manded by Jasper and Newton, and was with them when they rescued the American prisoners at a spring 2 miles out of Savannah known for 100 years as Jasper Spring. I was born in Newton County, Ga. named for the other illustricus officer. Grandfather Middlebrooks was in the Battle of Savannah and assisted in carrying Count Pulaski from the field when shot dead from his howse. He was six months a prisoner in Charleston, S. C. and was starved and eaten by vermin nearly to death before he escaped. O, how I love and cherish my Grandwathers memory. I got all of this from my mother (Bethenia Middlebrooks Wade, Mrs. Jesse Wade)

Francis Marion in South Carolina for three years, the war of 1812 and in the battle of New Orleans on the 8th Jan 1813 when Gen Andrew Jacksons! army destroyed the English Army under Tackingham. I think you and sister can join daughters (meaning DAR)
